The South African Optometric Association (SAOA) Centennial Conference 2024.

The South African Optometric Association (SAOA) is a cornerstone in the optometry field in South Africa, established in 1924, making this year its Centenary year. It serves as a professional and representative body dedicated to regulating the Optometric industry, protecting the public and supporting over 1,600 registered optometrists and professional lens distributors- known as Opticians. The SAOA plays a pivotal role in enhancing the quality of eye care through various

means, including regulation, advocacy, education, and support for its members.

The SAOA celebrated it's 100-year anniversary with the Centennial Conference & Celebrations, held from July 18 to 20, 2024, at Emperors Palace in Kempton Park, Gauteng. This event aimed to celebrate the profession's advancements and provide a platform for education and networking.

The conference commenced with an inspiring opening ceremony marked by a stirring performance from renowned South African singer, Vicky Sampson. She opened the session with the heartfelt rendition of the National Anthem, and concluded the ceremony with her compelling performance of "African Dream".

Alt text is essential for making the internet more accessible to people who are blind or have low vision. It enables screen readers to convey the content of images through spoken word or Braille, allowing users with vision-related disabilities to fully engage with online content. Despite its significance, the absence of effective alt text can significantly hinder the online experience for many users. Efforts to improve alt text include manual addition by users, Al-generated descriptions by platforms, and advocacy for better accessibility

practices.

Empowering Change: The Ratification of the African Disability Protocol and Its Impact on South Africa.

In a historic move, fifteen African nations, including South Africa, have ratified the African Disability Protocol (ADP), marking a significant milestone in the fight for the rights of over 80 million Africans with disabilities. This ratification is not just a legal formality but a beacon of hope for individuals who have long been marginalized and faced discrimination due to disabilities.

The ADP addresses the unique challenges that people with disabilities in Africa face, including combating superstitions, harmful cultural practices, and systemic discrimination. It builds upon the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (UNCRPD), tailoring its provisions to the African context to ensure relevance and effectiveness.

For South Africa, a country with a complex history of addressing inequality, the ratification of the ADP represents a commitment to enhancing the rights and opportunities of its disabled population.

Many who tried it found the results way beyond expectations, and at least one person was heard to say 'I can see again ... I can see faces, I can read, I can see pictures!'

Retina SA at the Paralympic Games.



It is with great excitement that Retina South Africa can announce that three of our members, **Alani Ferreira**, **Danika Vyncke**, and **Jaco Smit** have been selected to represent South Africa in the upcoming Paralympic Games in Paris later this month. We extend our heartfelt congratulations to these talented para athletes for their hard work, dedication, and perseverance. Their achievements are a testament to their exceptional skills and determination, and we are incredibly proud to have them represent our country on this prestigious international stage.

Retina South Africa has, over the last year, been concentrating on fostering inclusivity in sports by encouraging our members to take up sports. It is very difficult for visually impaired persons to engage in sports in South Africa. Nearly all visually impaired sports require a sighted guide to compete alongside the sportsperson. This means that the cost of attending any activity is always doubled, and there is very little funding available to assist these athletes with their events. Often, they receive support only during Commonwealth Games and Paralympic sports events, with no support for attending other

sporting events to qualify for these larger contests.

Despite these challenges, Retina South Africa still believes it is crucial for our members to participate in sports as it leads to better health and overall well-being. Our first event incorporating our new 'Save Our Sight' program, which encourages sport participation amongst our members, was the Ride for Sight early in February, where 34 competitors with disabilities took part. On the 3rd of August, Retina SA hosted a taster session for golf together with South African Blind Golf Association, and we hope to also introduce vision-impaired individuals to lawn bowls and indoor spinning later this year.

Participation in sports offers unparalleled benefits, including improved physical health, vision health, enhanced mental well-being, and greater social integration. For individuals with visual impairments, these activities provide a unique platform for empowerment and inclusion. It is essential to recognise that the ability to see does not define one's capability to participate and excel in sports. Through collective support and the promotion of inclusive sports initiatives, we can ensure that everyone, regardless of visual ability, has the opportunity to engage in sports, enjoy the camaraderie, and celebrate the achievements that come with it.
